The Plains March 31st 1869

My dear Uncle

As Bessy cannot find
much to say that will interest
you I thought I would finish
the sheet of paper in writing to you.

that he had such a severe cold
that he was almost unable
to speak to you. we had a
lovely ride on Saturday, you
could almost fancy it was
a summer day if there had
been any foliage on the trees.
we expect to have service
in the church next Sunday
although it is not nearly com-
pleted, but I have no doubt
we shall enjoy going there
again.

We had a violent equino-
xial storm on Monday and
yesterday. Broad Run quite
overflowed the meadow at
the back of the house. it was
so swollen with the rain.
Anne had one of her nervous

headaches by going out in the
wind, but to day she is quite well
and practising her hymns for
next Sunday. she was very sorry
to be so unwell when you were
here, as it made every thing
out of order.

the children are perfectly delighted
with the Lectrope, and the
books Jack sent them, they
are certainly the happiest set
of children I ever saw. I suppose
you have seen Cousin Ann but
I have not heard from Mrs Lee
how she is since I left home.
