My dear Doctor,

You will perhaps be surprised at finding my letter dated at this place. I have been here since ~~X~~ <sup>me</sup>, holding services for the resident Americans according to the forms of our P. B. These services, I am glad to say, have been well attended.

I have taken great pains to cultivate the acquaintance of the Russian pastor here (Nicholas Guchnowsky) who has received me very kindly. When I visit his chapel he gives me a seat behind the iconostasis, and comes occasionally to our services. He is an intelligent man, well-affected to ~~U~~ <sup>U</sup> Unity; and has forwarded to Petersburg a statement concerning the friendly lines of our communion to the "Orthodox Church", which I prepared for him.
