At my arrival in this island I directed you a letter in Greek, of which I have been not so happy to receive the answer. Our examination took place on the tenth and eleventh ultimo; it was not public, and the prizes have not been ² yet ¹ distributed; for, the sickness of Mrs Bryan obliged him ~~Mr. Bryan~~ to leave us on the tenth, and accompany her to England: hoping that the change of air might restore her to health.

My brother and my cousin are quite well, and we three are devoting ourselves, during these two month of vacations, to the study of the English and

French languages, specially
to that of the former.

ress.
