My Dear Mr Hill.

Early this morning I received your letter of yesterday. I was glad to see that you had received the 2 copies of the prospectus I sent you as well as the Report. but I was no less surprised to find that you had not mentioned any thing about the 50 copies of a letter that I sent you, which, first appeared in the "Spizden" and afterwards printed here in the form of a tract by some friends, the title of it is "Συμπλοκή της Νεοεξουδωριστικής Δίψης" by Νικηφόρος Σαββίδης. I intrusted them to the care of a young man improving Bolivian, also a letter with them to you -

Your letter to the Hon. & Joy Morris shall be handed to him by myself as soon as he arrives here -

By today's steamer leaves our city for yours Mr and Mrs Segen of New York - They may have letters to you from some other friends. They are to remain but few days in your city having lost too much time here in Syru in consequence of a mistake.

All my family are perfectly well - My wife and I salute you all - I intended coming over to your city to spend a week but I find that it will not do for the present - I may however in a month or ~~more~~ - Believe Dear Sir ever your sincerely
