

Confidential Geneva 26th April 1848

My dear Sir, ^{Δρα' ρα' περιεργασίας, 26/4/48.}

I have written you some days since, regarding our Emergency affair, but have not as yet heard from you on the subject, but must be so. I have Mr. Abbott leaves by this boat, & goes to see how affairs stand I presume at Athens - as he wishes to heat for the mines probably. - Our object is to come to some arrangement with the Greeks Gov^t & him, to the satisfaction of all parties - therefore if you can ^{Κατανομή} tho' we forget no give us your good word I shall feel much obliged to you.
