(for Sunday) by anti-  
cipating yesterday.

but every day brings  
some news - We had  
letters from the Jennings  
from Trieste - all well  
so far. Give our loves  
to Mrs Hill & Miss Hall.  
I hope the General  
& Mr Marsh have be-  
come acquainted, and  
that the latter is well &
