Dear Mr Hill

You cannot think how much pleasure your dear letter gave to me and to my mama. I heartily thank you for the kind expressions which it contains of which I am not worthy. I did nothing I am sure to deserve so much praises. I loved you it is true as if you were my own parents, but with that I did nothing more than any body else would have done for persons so much interested to their welfare. I will try not to neglect your good counsils but to have them always before my mind. I regularly read the Scriptures as you wrote me and find in them great comfort. Last Sunday I went to Church and I sang. I intended to go this Sunday also, but my sister wishes me to go out in the country and spend a week with her, so I am prevented of going. My poor sister

is so unfortunate, that I must do all that is
in my power to please her, her husband is continually
suffering, and for that account he cannot work
to supply the wants of his family. Just imagine
in what condition they are. God is Merciful
and willing to do good, perhaps if you pray
to Him, He will hear you and grant your
requests. Do pray then for my brother-in-law
that he may be recovered, and get his usual
strength. Perhaps I give you too much trouble
but you are so good that I am sure you will
excuse my abuse of your kindness.

I want to ask you another favor, that is, to write
me now and then, if it does not give you much
trouble. I know I am too much indiscreet to
ask you so many things, but I cannot help it
I need them both a great deal.

but you ^{know} that I am not well acquainted with
the English language.
